Welcome to the summer ENCEPH-UK/UK-ChiMES Newsletter

The studies have now been running for about 9 months for ENCEPH-UK and 7 months for UK-ChiMES, the UK-Childhood Meningitis and Encephalitis Study). Recruiting sites and patients to our studies continues well.

We now have 41 hospitals open to recruit into the studies and to date have 83 adults and 380 children.

We now have 172 people who have had encephalitis in the past who have agreed to take part in the retrospective study and who have helped with our sub-studies on investigating people's experience of having had encephalitis and also assessing the problems that may be experienced afterwards.

We are very thankful indeed to all who have agreed to take part in any of the studies we look forward to assessing the results in order to help others who may develop encephalitis or meningitis. Without you we wouldn't be able to do this!


