Welcome to the Spring ENCEPH-UK Newsletter



In our first Newsletter just before Christmas, we introduced you to the ENCEPH-UK Programme of studies.

We now have 25 hospitals open to recruit into these studies and to date have recruited 37 adults and 86 children into the UK-ChiMES study (UK-Childhood Meningitis and Encephalitis Study), which is a sister study to ENCEPH-UK where we are collaborating with Oxford University.

We have 41 people who have had encephalitis in the past who have agreed to take part in the retrospective study and who have helped with our sub-studies on investigating peoples experience of having had encephalitis and also assessing the problems that it has caused.

We are very thankful to those of you who have agreed to participate in any part of our studies. Your help is much appreciated and without you we would not be able to do these studies.

As the studies are getting underway, we're excited that in the coming newsletter we'll be able to give you some feedback about some preliminary results!
